A message from our Board President...

Every non-profit organization relies on its founders

to guide it from inception through the growth process, and then to hopefully ensure its longevity and that it continues to be true to its mission and purpose. Sadly, Gill Children's Services lost one of its founders, Martine H. Ginsburg, last fall on November 16th. At 96 years of age, Martine was actively engaged in the work of Gill until shortly before her death: voting to approve a special request for medical assistance for a child in need.

Martine died peacefully in the home that she and her husband, Marcus, built and in which she lived for over sixty three years. It was also in this home, at the dining room table, that at the age of 63 Martine and her dear friend, Ginny Richards, initially created Gill Children's Services in response to a \$1,000,000 bequest by A. Smith Gill, a relatively unknown local benefactor. The original intent was to give the money away as quickly as possible to the children of Tarrant

County with unmet needs. However, as they soon discovered, there was a great need for an organization that would be a last resort for children, after all other sources of funding had been tapped. In 2010, as Martine mused upon seeing the new Gill permanent offices, "this may really outlive me and continue to provide for the children long after I am gone. That's something Ginny and I never even dreamed was a possibility." Now, 34 years later, Gill has provided almost \$10,000,000 to approximately 50,000 children in Tarrant County.

While Martine was instrumental in founding or guiding several other social organizations in Tarrant County, her greatest community achievement was the establishment of Gill as the only organization in Tarrant County, and perhaps in Texas and the United States, with the sole purpose of taking care of the unmet needs of children. **No child has ever been turned away from Gill as a last resort.**

As Gill approaches its 35th anniversary in 2014, the Board of Directors reaffirms its commitment to improving the lives of children, in recognition of the wishes of Martine, and with the continued guidance of co-founder Ginny Richards. We thank our donors for their continued support and we look forward to being available to any child who truly needs Gill's assistance!

As I settled in on a flight to Washington, D.C., recently holding a copy of the Star-Telegram, I read of the passing of my long-time friend, Martine Ginsburg. My first reaction was one of sadness until I began thinking of the many contributions of this remarkable woman and the legacy she leaves.

Martine spent a goodly portion of her life tirelessly working for the benefit of those less fortunate than she, especially children with various needs. She served on the board of directors of several children's agencies, but the one especially dear to her heart was Gill Children's Services, an agency she helped establish some 30 years ago. Over the years, thousands of children with special needs received a variety of lifeimproving benefits under the aegis of this organization, and Martine was right there to see that they did. That was her mission, and she took that responsibility very seriously.

I'm sorry I missed attending her memorial service, but I know that Martine forgives my absence. Somehow, she is aware that I raised a glass and toasted her in Washington. Goodbye, my friend.


Online shoppers raised money for Gill and enjoyed great deals at the same time!

State of Gill By Amanda Stallings, Executive Director

As always, Gill's team is hard at work to continue Martine's legacy of making sure no child goes without needed services. Most services are consistent with years past, but we are seeing an increase in several areas. Prescriptions, birth certificates, and specialized medical equipment are the main areas where Gill is seeing a higher demand for assistance. As the end of April approaches, Gill will begin to see our yearly requests for summer school assistance.

Many families struggle with maintaining Medicaid and CHIP and often these services lapse and families need temporary assistance to fill their child's prescription. Other times, families who have traditional insurance, but may need an unexpected temporary prescription, require help for the amount that exceeds their uncovered insurance costs. Gill has seen an increase of 27%, already this year.

Birth certificates are needed to apply for Medicaid and CHIP, food stamps, housing, or to enroll your child in school. The \$23 required to purchase a birth certificate is a stumbling block for families trying to obtain these services for their child(ren). The 10% increase in requests indicates this is becoming a more significant problem.

Medicaid and CHIP are constantly changing the services they will cover for children. As new services are provided to families, Gill will see changes in the services requested of our agency. Therefore, while Gill provided literally no funding for medical equipment in 2012, already this year we have spent over \$3,000.

As the end of the school year draws near, Gill will be inundated with applications for summer school assistance. Last year, Gill provided 272 children with summer school assistance, and this year we expect that number to increase. Most children attending public school are required to pay for summer school assistance. Gill only assists those children who did not gain the skills necessary to advance to the next grade. For some of these families, if Gill did not help, they would be forced to repeat the grade.

In an effort to ensure that as many as possible know of our services, the Gill team has met throughout the year with school principals, vice principals, counselors. and nurses to educate them on how we can help children in their schools. Although our relationship with Tarrant County schools has been in place for over 30 years, turn-over, job relocation, and new hires always present a challenge. Gill works diligently to remind them yearly about our program, so that every child will receive the needed services they require.
